Course Prefix and Number: ENG 217 **Credits:** 3

Course Title: Creative Writing – Poetry I

Course Description:

Introduces the fundamentals and techniques of writing poetry.

10.6 hours per week. 3 credits

General Course Purpose:

ENG 217 introduces the study and practice of poetic writing techniques, including voice, prosody, metaphor, imagery, style, symbolism, and revision. Students will complete informal and formal writing assignments, and will analyze selected published and non-published poetry. Workshops and peer evaluation will provide class and instructor critiques for writing. ENG 217 has been designated as a "writing intensive" course according to standards developed by the English department.

Course Prerequisites and Co-requisites:

Prerequisite: ENG 111 or approval by the English program head

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon completing the course, the student will be able to

- Write a variety of poems in many styles and on many subjects;
- Understand and apply the fundamental elements of poetry

Major Topics to Be Included:

- Practice in writing poetry, including the completion of informal and formal writing assignments
- Introduction to the techniques of writing poetry, including voice, prosody, metaphor, imagery, style, and symbolism
- Practice in revising poems
- Analysis of selected published and non-published poetry
- Class and instructor critique of student's poems through class workshops and peer evaluation
